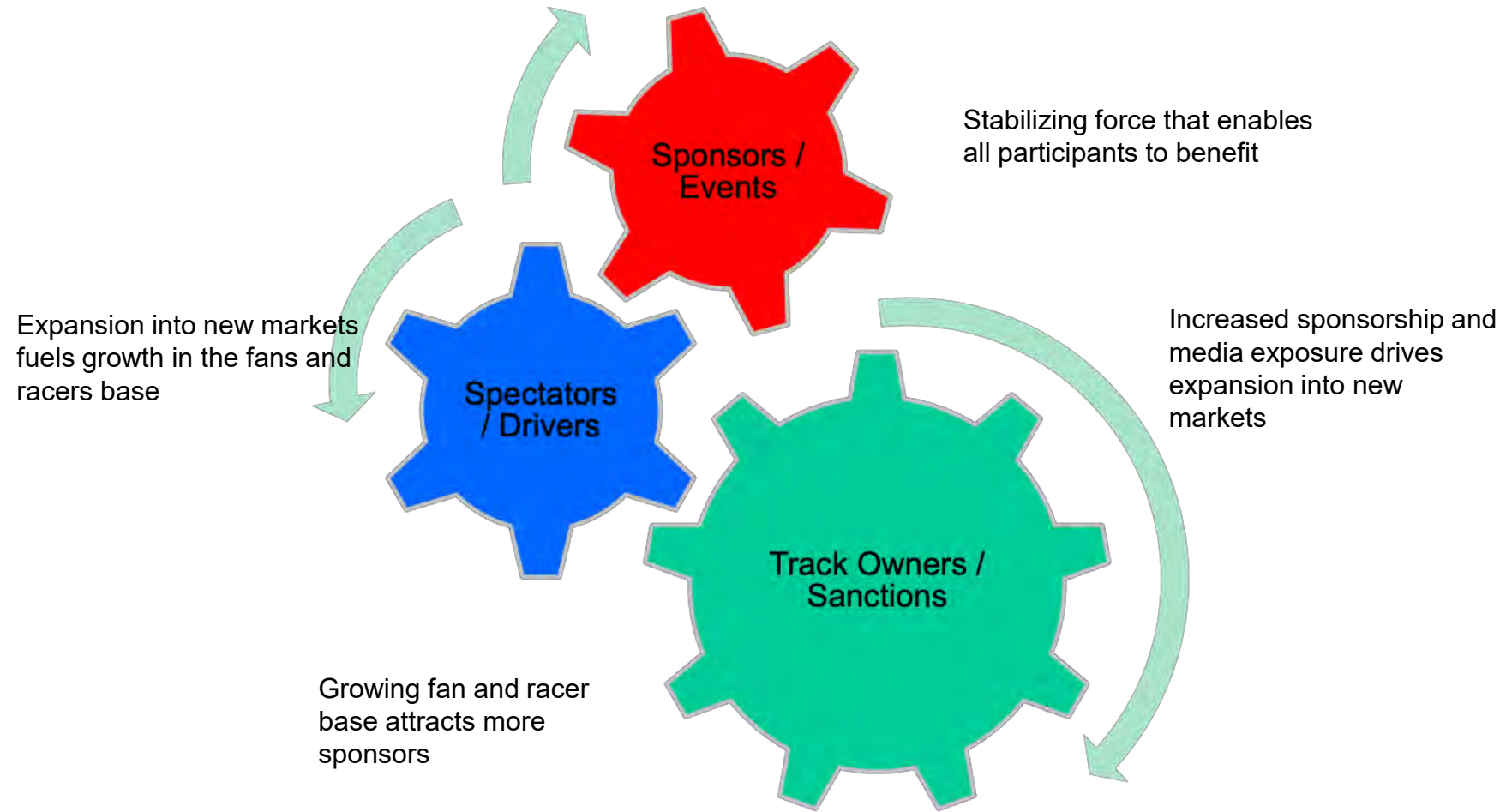

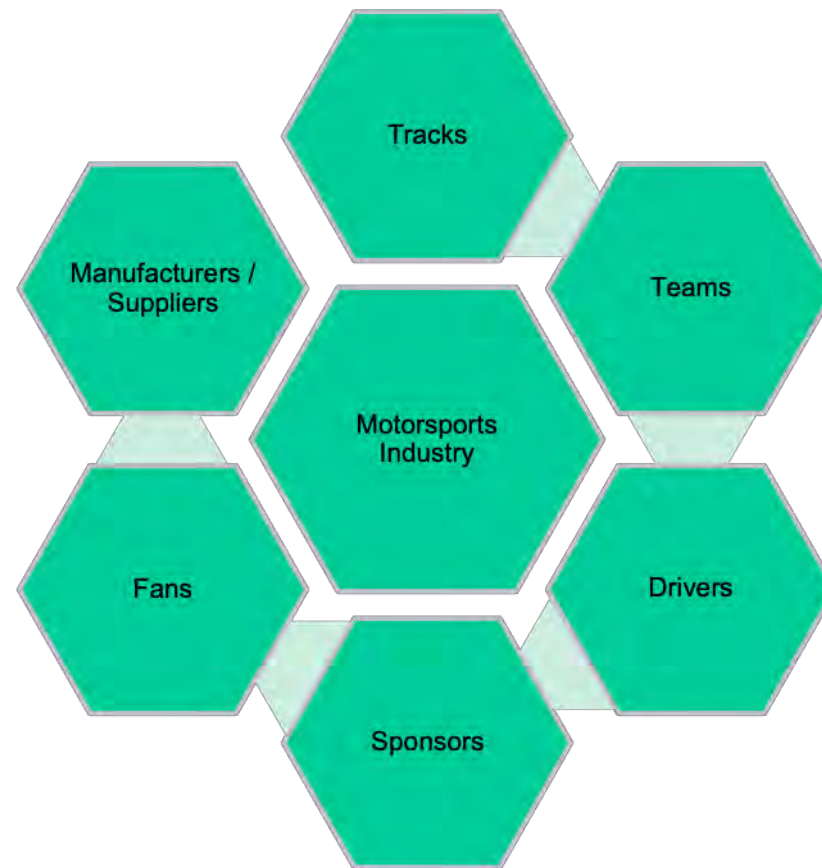


The Industry

Executive Summary

- **More than 1,200 facilities operate in all 50 states**
- **More than 250 sanctioning organizations**
- **More than 15,000 events annually**
- **More than 43,000,000 fans attend motorsports events each year.**
- **More than 57,000 race teams compete at racetracks across the country.**
- **Attendance by participants (drivers, crew members, and owners) exceeds 8,000,000 people per year.**
- **Tracks generate nearly \$1.8 billion dollars in revenue each year.**
- **Teams spend in excess of \$4.7 billion dollars annually.**
- **There are nearly 16,000 full-time and 30,000 part-time employees at racetracks across the country.**
- **Almost 25,000 business (approximately 25 per track) are directly impacted by racetracks.**
- **Motorsports is big business – Grassroots Motorsports is the foundation!**

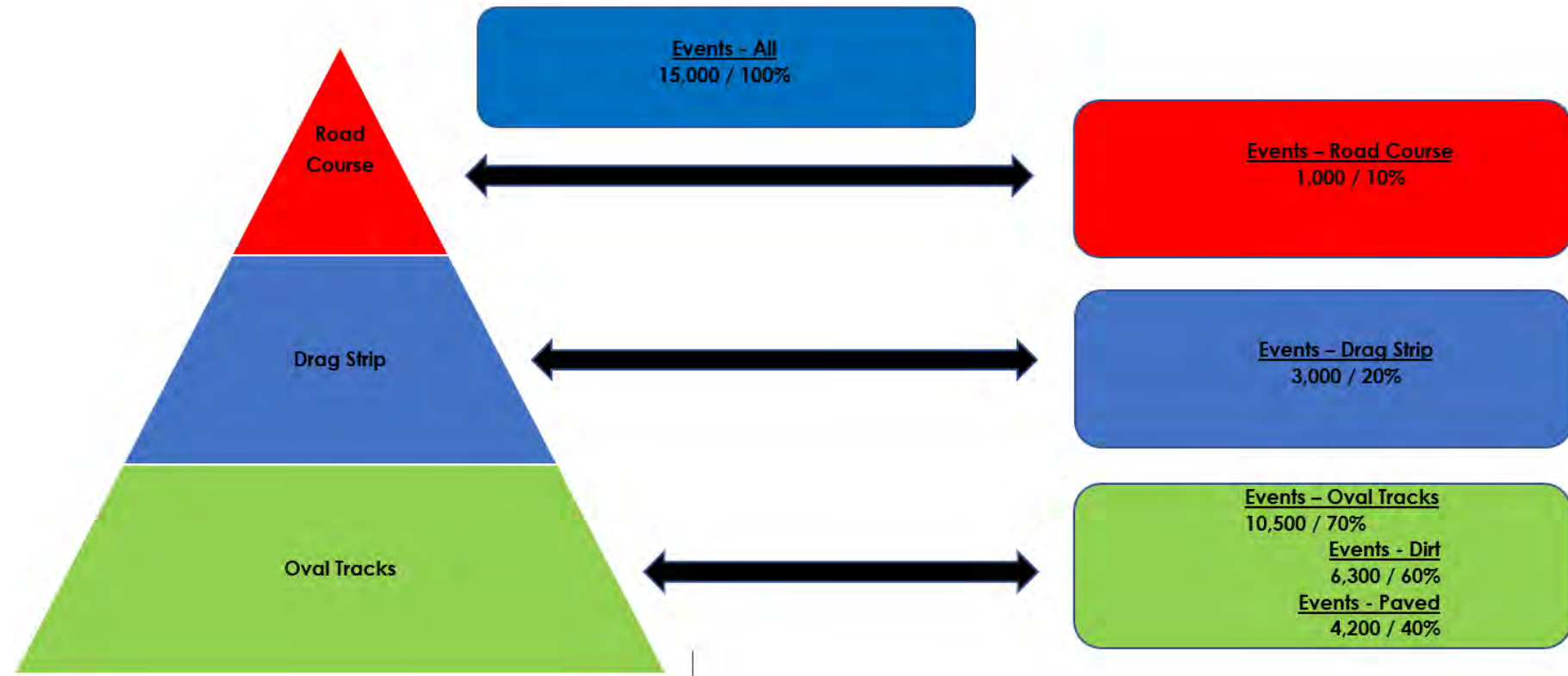

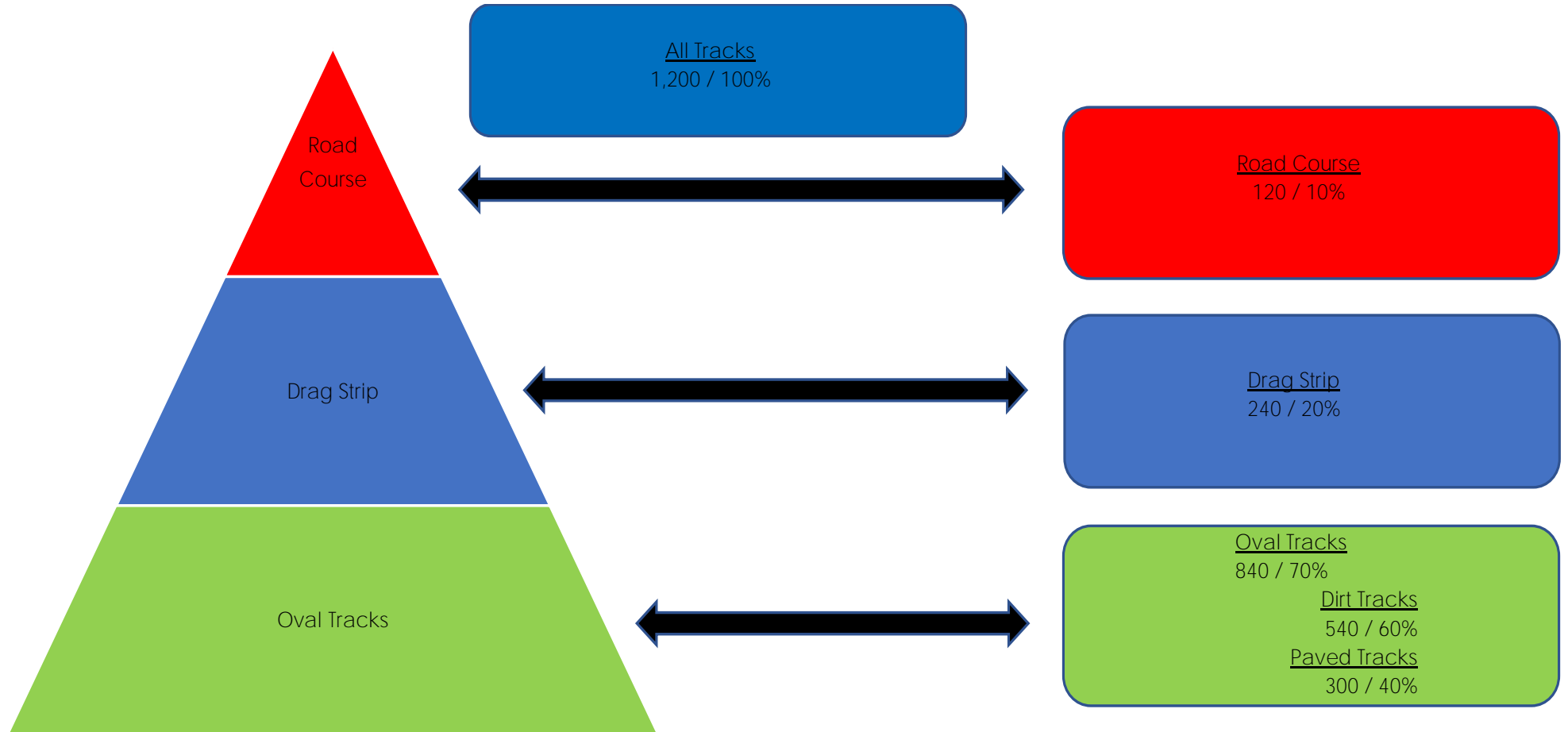

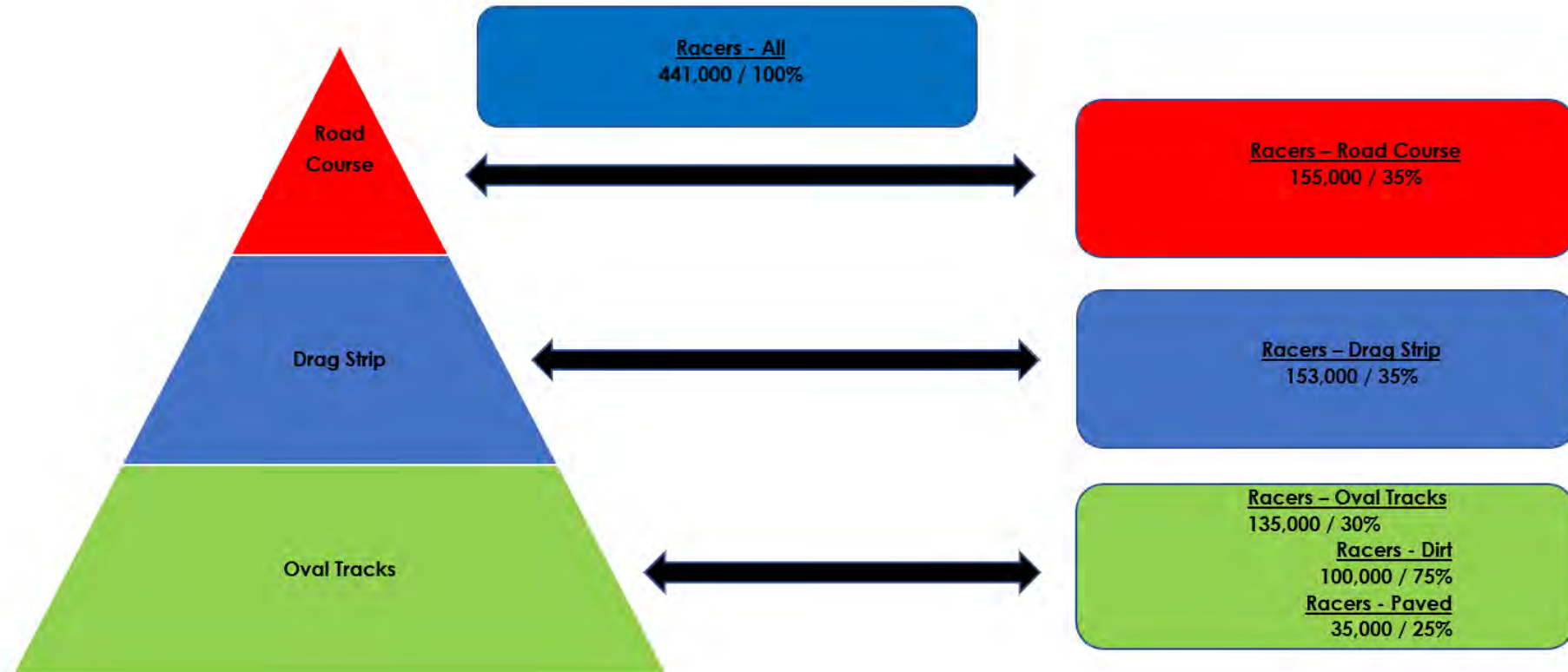

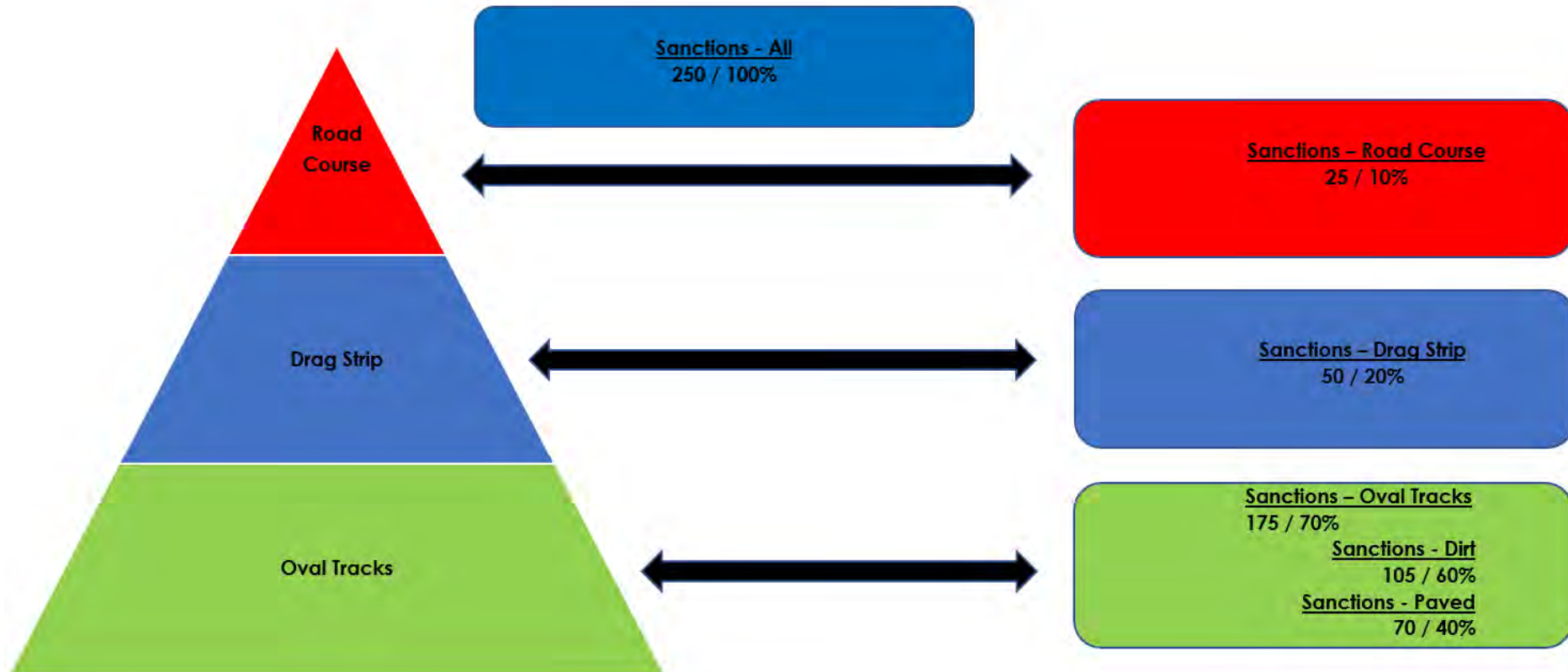

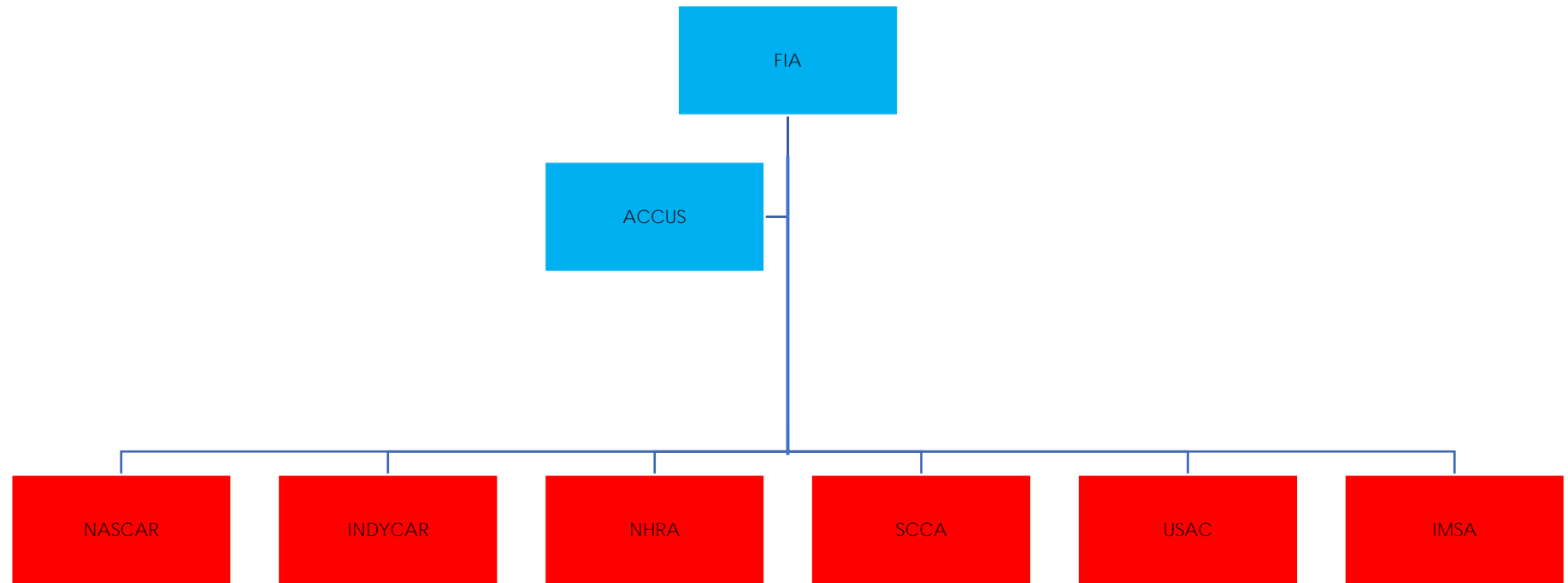

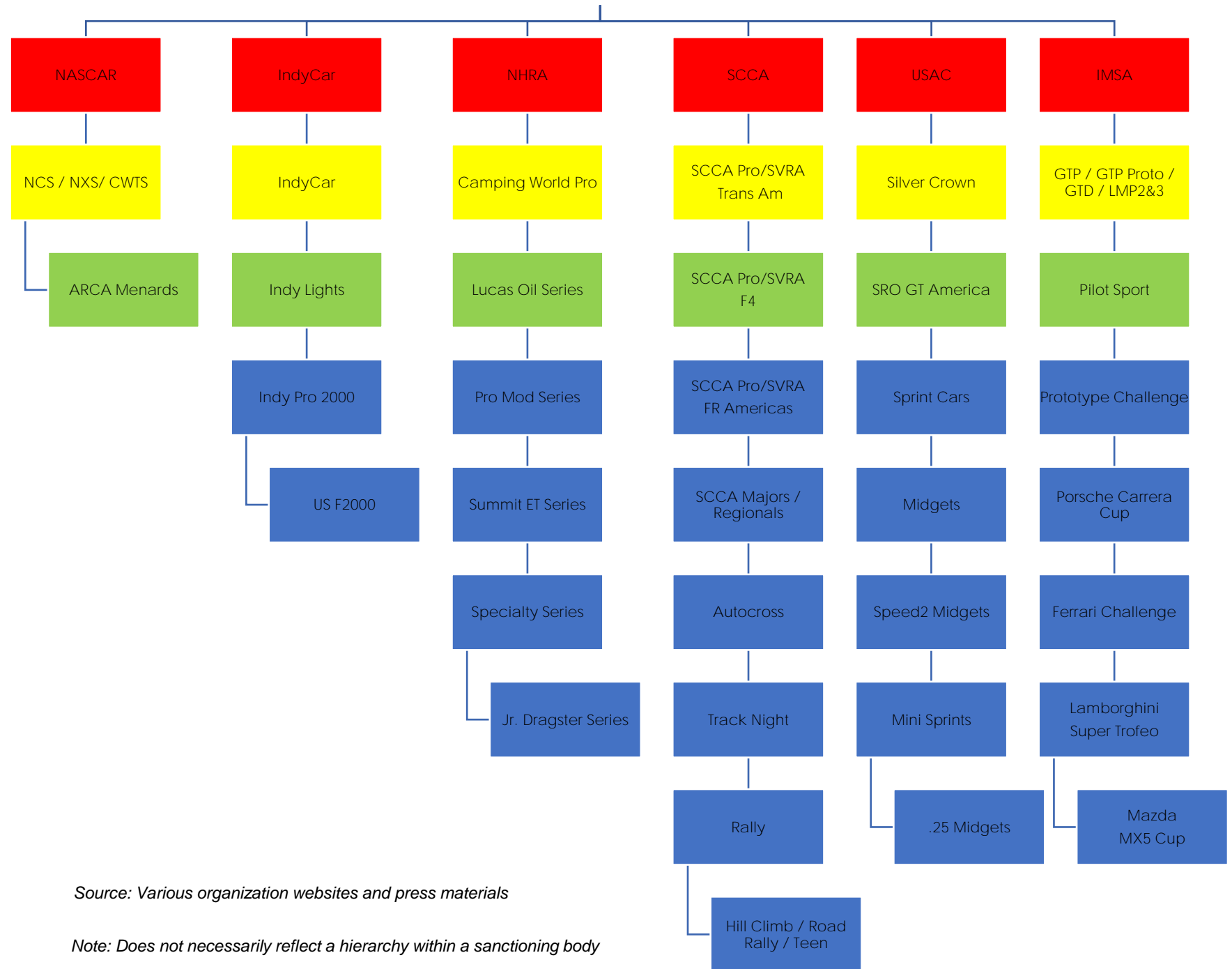

Organization Chart of USA Major Professional Racing Series Sanctioning Bodies



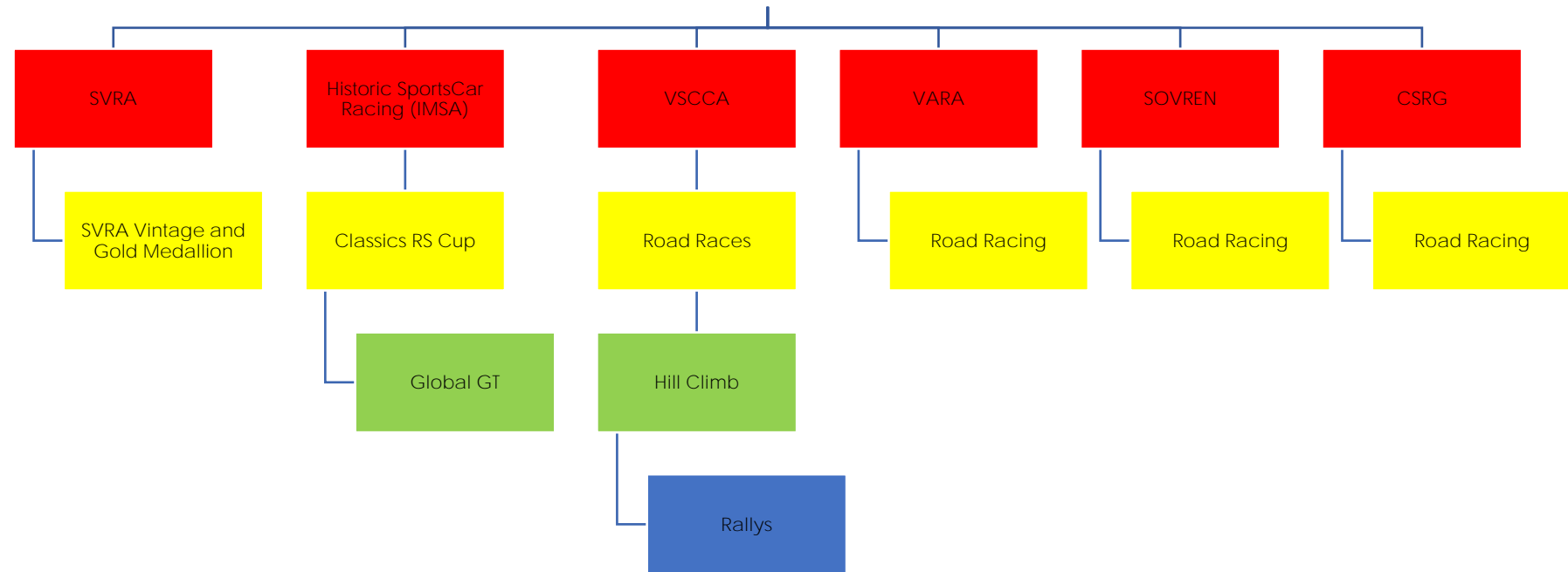
USA 4-Wheel Motorsports Major Series By Sanctioning Body

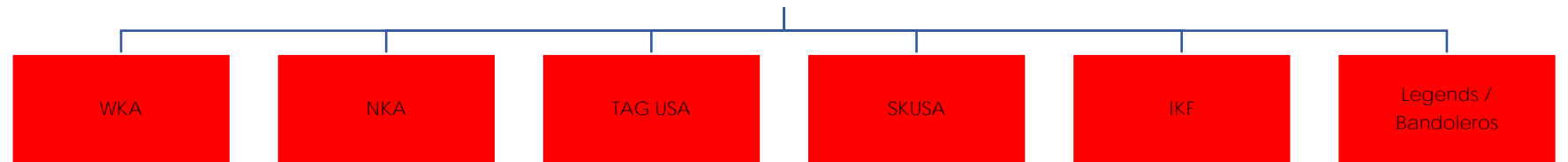
USA Vintage 4-wheel Motorsports Series By Sanctioning Body

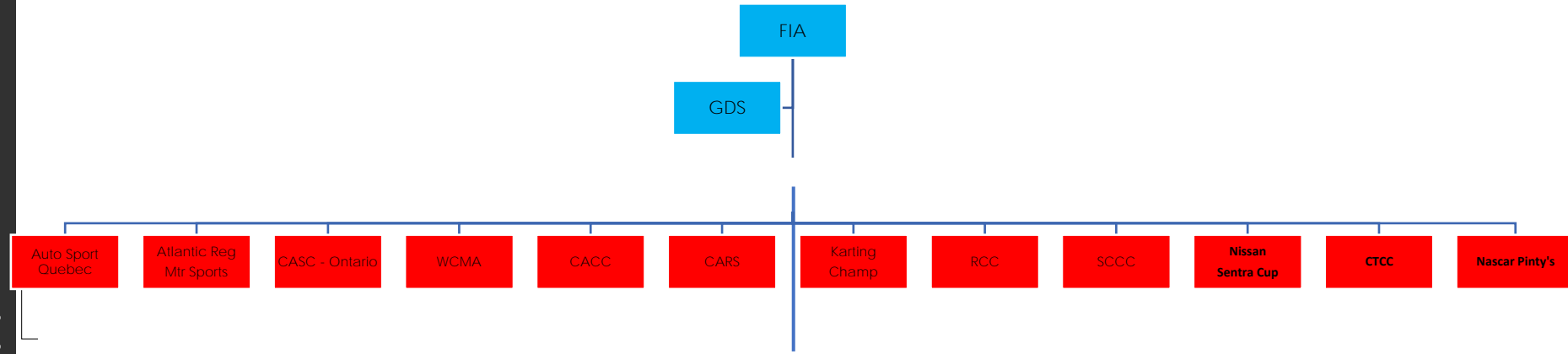
USA Karting and Grassroots Racing Series

USA 4-Wheel Sanctioning Organizations

[ACCUS: Automobile Competition Committee for the United States](#)

- An umbrella organization of auto racing sanctioning bodies in the United States and the official liaison of U.S. sanctioning bodies to the Fédération Internationale de l'Automobile.

[FIA: Fédération Internationale de l'Automobile](#)

- An association established in 1904 to represent the interests of motoring organizations and motor car users. The FIA is mostly known as the governing body for many auto racing events, such as Formula One.

[IHRA: International Hot Rod Association](#)

- An international sanctioning body for drag racing

[IMSA: International Motorsports Association](#)

- A division of NASCAR and a North American sports car racing sanctioning body based in Daytona Beach, Florida

[INDYCAR: Indy Car Racing Series](#)

- An American-based auto racing sanctioning body for Indy car racing and other disciplines of open wheel car racing

USA 4-wheel Sanctioning Organizations (cont.)

[NASCAR: National Association for Stock Car Auto Racing](#)

- An American auto racing sanctioning and operating company that is best known for stock car racing is headquartered in Daytona Beach, Florida.

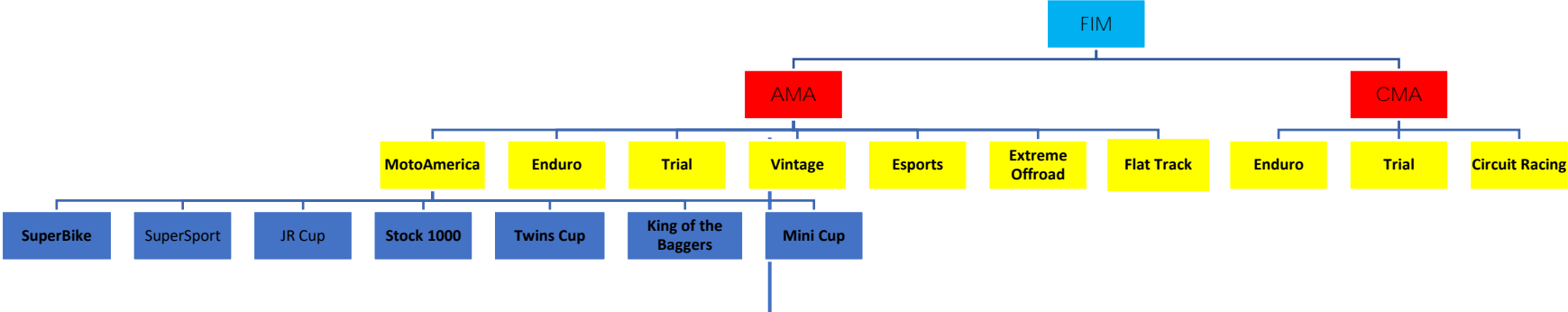

- An association established in 1904 organization acting in all matters connected with motorcycling activities (sporting & non-sporting) and defending the rights and interests of motorcycle users and industry.

[AMA: American Motorcyclist Association](#)

- Founded in 1924, the AMA has protected the future of motorcycling and promoted the motorcycle lifestyle. As the world's largest motorcycling organization, the AMA advocates for motorcyclists' interests in the halls of local, state and federal government, the committees of international governing organizations, and the court of public opinion. Through member clubs, promoters and partners, the AMA sanctions more motorsports competition and motorcycle recreational events than any other organization in the world. Competition areas include vintage, enduro, esports, extreme off-road and flat track.

Moto America:

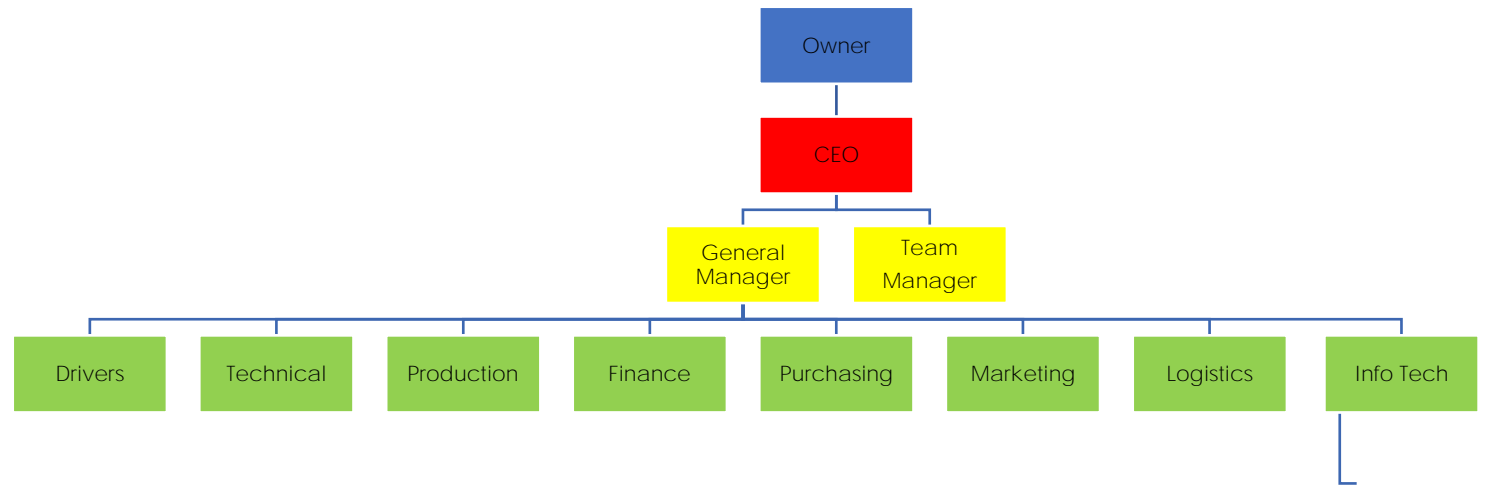
- An American-based organization officially sanctioned by the American Motorcyclist Association (AMA) and the Fédération Internationale de Motocyclisme (FIM), operating and promoting seven classes of motorcycle road racing: Superbike, Supersport, Junior Cup, Stock 1000, Twins Cup, King Of The Baggers, and Mini Cup.

CMA: Canadian Motorcycle Association

- Since 1950, affiliated with the Federation Internationale de Motocyclisme (FIM), and responsible to oversee their interests in motorcycling and snowmobiling throughout Canada. CMA members have interests in all aspects of motorcycling from road riding to racing and trail riding. CMA affiliated clubs and promoters organize sanctioned activities in all disciplines.
